Santa Fe

Santa Fe is one of the most modern and dynamic areas in Mexico City, known for its contemporary architecture, business centers, universities, and entertainment venues. Located in the western part of the city, in the boroughs of Cuajimalpa and Álvaro Obregón, it is a major financial and business hub.

Mexico City is a vibrant fusion of ancient heritage and modern energy. With world-class museums, buzzing street markets, and a dynamic culinary scene, every corner offers something unforgettable.

Polanco

A sophisticated neighborhood known for luxury dining, designer boutiques, art galleries, and cultural spaces—often compared to the Upper East Side or Champs-Élysées.

Mexico City (continued)

Historic Center & Zócalo

The cultural and historical heart of Mexico City, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- **Zócalo – Plaza de la Constitución:** One of the largest public squares in the world.
- [National Palace](#): Home to Diego Rivera's murals depicting Mexican history. Free entry with ID.
- **Madero Street:** Pedestrian street with historic buildings, shops, cafés, and street performers.

Other Notable Attractions:

- [Chapultepec Castle](#): A historic castle offering panoramic views of the city and housing the National History Museum.
- [Chapultepec Forest](#): One of the largest city parks in the Western Hemisphere, featuring museums, a zoo, and recreational areas.
- [Frida Kahlo Museum \(Casa Azul\)](#): The former home of artist Frida Kahlo, now a museum displaying her personal belongings and artworks.
- [Metropolitan Cathedral](#): The largest cathedral in the Americas, blending Renaissance, Baroque, and Neoclassical architectural styles.
- [National Museum of Anthropology](#): A must-visit to understand Mexico's indigenous heritage and pre-Hispanic civilizations.
- [Palacio de Bellas Artes](#): An architectural masterpiece hosting cultural events, including opera, dance, and art exhibitions.
- [Templo Mayor](#): An important Aztec temple complex with an adjacent museum showcasing artifacts from the site.
